TRICKS OF TRADE

How can we, as citizens and Christians, advocate for those who may be exploited or marginalized in today's society? What practical steps can we take to defend those who are vulnerable?
- 5. **Reflection on Personal Accountability and Community**: Berthold urges people to examine their actions, noting that sins like deceit, theft, and exploitation harm both individuals and communities. How does personal accountability contribute to the health of a community? In what ways can we support one another in resisting the temptations of greed, deceit, and anger?
